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Indirect Questions Perfect English Grammar

However, we use indirect questions in a different way from reported questions. Indirect questions are a way of being polite. They are very, very common in English, especially when you're talking to someone you don't know. 'Yes / No' Questions To make an indirect 'yes / no' question, we use 'if' and the word order of a normal positive sentence. This is the same as for reported 'yes / no' questions.

This is sometimes called an indirect question and is often used to be polite. Normal question: Where is the station? Indirect question (that includes an embedded question): Could you tell me where the station is? See my page about indirect questions for more information. 2: We can also use embedded questions as part of statements. The embedded question is a noun clause and can be used in a similar way to a noun.

Reported Speech - Perfect English Grammar

Direct question: What do you want? Indirect question: Can you tell me what you want? Direct question: When did she leave? Indirect question: Do you know when she left? In yes/no questions, if or whether is used. The word order is the same as in reported questions. Direct question: Have you seen my dog? Indirect question: Could you tell me if you have seen my dog?

Direct and Indirect Questions in English - Espresso English

An indirect question is not a question at all. In a direct question, the auxiliary verb comes before the subject. However, in an indirect question, the auxiliary verb comes after the subject. What's more, an indirect question ends with a full stop, not a question mark.
